Orange County Speedway will be hosting a night full of side-by-side racing with the running of the OCS 250 Saturday, August 28. Fans are guaranteed a full night jammed full of some of the best three groove grassroots racing in the area. There will be exciting racing similar to the OCS 255, which was held August 7. In that race, a three way battle arose in the late model Division. Drivers Terry Dease and Melvin Langley both had disagreements with the former track champion Stacy Puryear. While racing for the lead, an altercation arose between Dease and Puryear, which caused them both to spin out in turns three and four. Following that, Langley and Puryear got into it, causing Langley and his crew to become very upset with Puryear following the race. During all of the commotion, point's leader Craig Moore was able to sneak by and grab the lead. Moore was able also able to hold off Dease in a dramatic green-white-checked finish, which allowed him to take home his fourth victory of the season. After the race Dease told the crowd; "They can call me what they want. I'm driving this car and I ain't got no friends." In the Limited division, 13-year-old Jesse Little beat former OCS track champion Donald Brace and 15 other drivers to win. In the Pure Stock division, Keith Edwards' winning streak was broken by Dennis Sargent Jr. A great show was also put on in the Street Stock division, which provided fans with tons of beating and banging. The excitement can only carry over to the OCS 250. As you enter the grandstands for the OCS 250, stop by and visit the Flat River Antique Engine and Tractor Club, who will have a display at the front entrance. While you are there you may also purchase a 50/50 ticket, which will raise money to help support Hospice. A Street Stock Pit Party is scheduled to begin at 6:30p.m. So come out to meet and great with some of your favorite drivers such as; Clyde Johnson, Gary Ledbetter, Chris Womack, Michael Worthington, Richard Hayden, Chet Christman and the rest of the OCS Street Stock drivers. The night's agenda will consist of Late Models, Limiteds, Modifieds, Grand Stocks, Street Stocks, and the East Coast Flat Head Fords. Final practice for the OCS 250 is anticipated to start at 2:30 p.m., with qualifying at 5:15 p.m., and racing starting at 7 p.m. The front ticket gates will open at 6 p.m., but fans are welcome to come early for final practice and qualifying by entering through the front ticket office. General admission tickets are \$10. Tickets for Senior citizens 65 and older are only \$5. Fans with a valid military, university, fire department, law enforcement, Duke, or Mariah Parham identification, can also gain admission for only \$5. Kids 10 and under are FREE.
